







September 1 Hop Stocks Up 28 Percent From Last Year

The inventory of hops held by growers, dealers, and brewers on September 1, 2010 totaled 83.0 million pounds, down 19 percent from March but 28 percent more than September 1, 2009 stocks. This is the highest September 1 inventory on record.

Stocks held by brewers, at 45.0 million pounds, were up 13 percent from a year ago. Stocks held by dealers and growers on September 1, 2010 were 38.0 million pounds, up 52 percent from the stocks on hand last year.

Statistical Methodology

Survey Procedures: Grower surveys are conducted in the three estimating States to collect stocks of hops held by growers. Additionally, contacts are made to collect stocks held by brewers and dealers.

Estimating Procedures: Information obtained from the hops stocks grower, dealer, and brewers surveys are used to establish estimates of hops stocks. These estimates are reviewed for errors, reasonableness, and consistency with historical estimates.

Revision Policy: All hop stocks estimates are subject to revision the following year based on a thorough review of all available data.

Reliability: Survey results are subject to non-sampling errors such as omission, duplication, imputation for missing data, and mistakes in reporting, recording, and processing the data. These errors cannot be measured directly, but are minimized through rigid quality controls in the data collection process and a careful review of all reported data for consistency and reasonableness.
